



Our Goal


To improve the scope and quality of MNCH services across Sindh province, in both public and private health sectors, so that we can save lives of mothers, newborns and children

And a quality of care that she deserves!








And access to fully equipped hospitals when she needs them.



Success Story: Implants



In government and PPHI health facilities, over 40,000 women have received implants during last 1 year.

Postpartum Implant also introduced for the first time in Sindh.





Chlorhexidine Pilot



7,533

CHX tubes distributed in two districts



3,661

Newborns received CHX upon delivery



46

District rollout trainings completed





Newborn and Child Health

- 4,345 asphyxiated newborns revived at through Helping Babies Breathe (HBB) module.
- 127,000 Chlorhexidine gel tubes distributed in 16 districts.
- 117,375 children <5 years received treatment for pneumonia
- **425,586** children <5 years received treatment for diarrhea







Results are encouraging

- Antenatal care and facility deliveries by skilled birth attendants have increased
- Referrals for emergency and non-emergency cases have increased
- Newborn babies are getting better care
- Quality of care in govt. and private facilities has improved significantly
- Training institutions have been established





Jameela is our vision, our inspiration and our pride. She keeps us together as a team. She gives us courage to stand criticism, opposition and hardships. If we understand her commands and obey them, we will be successful.

If we fail her, we fail.
